

MCI STUDENT COUNCIL EXECUTIVE DUTIES**PRESIDENT**

Duties:

- To act as a spokesperson for the Student Body
- To call and preside over Student Council meetings, including creating a meeting agenda
- To assist in the planning & running of social & fundraising activities
- To work with his/her executive members to formulate an events calendar for the next school year (calendar is submitted to the office for approval by the end of the current school year)
- To serve as Master of Ceremonies for the Graduation dinner in the current school year
- To act as one of the cheque signees
- To check mail regularly and handle correspondence with the Secretary
- To assume a voting member's role on the Parent Advisory Council

VICE-PRESIDENT

Duties:

- To assist the president with his/her duties
- To assume the duties of the President in his/her absence
- To act as one of the cheque signees
- To take the minutes should the Secretary be absent
- To be the head of Student Council publicity, including maintaining the Student Council whiteboard & the electronic sign

TREASURER

Duties:

- To make sure that a Student Council budget is created and submitted to the office by the end of October
- To have charge of all association funds and to make all payments authorized by Student Council
- To act as one of the cheque signees
- To make a financial report to the Council at each meeting

SECRETARY

Duties:

- To keep the minutes of Student Council meetings, take roll call and send minutes to homerooms and the office following each meeting
- To assist the President in handling all correspondence for the Council
- To send thank-you cards as required
- To act as one of the cheque signees

SOCIAL CO-CHAIRS

Duties:

- To plan & organize social events for the student body, including dances, spirit weeks, activity periods and pep rallies
- To act as spokespersons for the Grade Representatives

MCI STUDENT COUNCIL WALL OF FAME

What is it?

The Student Council Wall of Fame was created by MCI students for the purpose of honouring MCI students in the areas of academics, athletics and school service. Any individual student awarded a plaque on the Wall of Fame has been nominated and chosen by a vote of all students in the school. School teams reaching the provincial level of competition will automatically be placed on the Wall of Fame. The full cost of, and responsibility for, creating and maintaining the Wall of Fame is borne by the students, through the Student Council.

General Rules:

- All individuals in all categories must be voted onto the Wall by the Student Body (must receive 1/3 of popular vote).
- A student may be elected to the Wall as many times as they are voted in, during their high school career.
- Teams will be listed as group (e.g. Girls Soccer, Provincial Champions, 1996/97).
- Any student winning two different categories will receive a plaque for each category.
- All nominations will occur at the same time as Student Council elections in May of each year and will be held on the same ballot as Student Council elections.
- If no nominations are made for a particular category, or if no candidate received 1/3 of the popular vote, no plaque will be awarded.
- Students will vote on candidates **according to grade**. Senior I's will vote for Senior I candidates. Senior II's will vote on their Senior II candidates and so on.

Nominations:

Any student can nominate a fellow student to the Wall of Fame in any of the three categories listed below. Nominators should consider the lists below as a guideline for qualification of a candidate. All nominations must have the signature of the Student Council President or Vice-President and Advisor. All nominations will be reviewed by Student Council and final approval must be given before a name will be placed on the ballot.

Nomination Requirements

Academics

Nominees for academics should:

- Be taking a min. of 6 credits in the current school year
- Exhibit a min. of 6 of the following criteria:
 - a. Uses free time to get help
 - b. Asks questions in class to aid learning
 - c. Helps others to learn
 - d. Uses spare time to study
 - e. Uses class time efficiently
 - f. Is punctual
 - g. Brings needed materials to class
 - h. Participates in class discussions

- i. Does not cheat or copy work
- j. Volunteers time in class
- k. Keeps their group on task during group work

Athletics

Individual nominees for athletics must:

- Have participated in 3 school-sponsored interscholastic sports
- Participation and sportsmanship are mandatory

- **NOTES:**

Any athletic team or individual that makes it to the Provincials will automatically be admitted to the Wall of Fame.

Teams that host provincials must earn their way into the Provincials (by winning Zone) to be admitted to the Wall of Fame.

School Service

Nominees for school service must:

- Must be a member of at least 3 of the following school supported groups:

Student Council
Managing Sports Teams
TADD
Yearbook
Grad Committee
Peer Tutoring
Credit Union Youth Board
Noon hour supervision (office, library)
Refereeing/Scorekeeping School Activities

- Participation and involvement should be considered for nominees

NOTE: Final approval must come from Student Council
